After two years of online teaching, the college resumed its academic and extra-curricular activities in the physical mode. DEPARTMENT REPORTS

DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS ECONOMICS

The Department of Business Economics organized enriching events throughout the year to inculcate the spirit of managerial decision making, optimum resource management, and harnessing business capabilities amongst its students. The academic year 2021-22 commenced with an orientation session for the first-year students, which was held on 22 November 2021. The orientation acted as the first mode of formal communication between students of the first year with their seniors and the faculty members of the department. The newcomers were informed about the curriculum, the time-table, the co-curricular activities conducted by the department and the composition as well as the ins and outs of the workings of the student body of the department.

The Alumni committee of the department, organized an alumni interaction event on 29 January 2022 in the online mode. This interaction aimed at gaining wisdom from alumni's experiences and on how they transitioned their life from campus to the corporate sector. The meet was addressed by Ms. Sanya Kharbanda from the batch of 2007-2010, currently working as senior HR Advisor at AkzoNobel; Mr. Ajay Malik, 1999-2002 batch, a Senior Associate Director at Colliers International, a renowned name in commercial real estate and Mr. Bhaskar Das, from the batch of 2002-2005, currently working as delivery lead for Nokia. The interaction helped students to follow industry trends, receiving insights from industry leaders on various significant aspects like personal branding, the skill-sets necessary for being corporate ready, and the possibility of gaining technical domain expertise like computer-science after pursuing Business economics.

The Workshop committee of the department organized a webinar on 'Profile Building for the Corporates' on 13 January 2022. The webinar was addressed by Ms. Mishika Rana, content marketer and personal branding strategist for LinkedIn and Twitter. The event was conducted in the online mode and its main objective was to educate students with regards to maximizing the full potential of professional networking site, LinkedIn to build and manage their profiles for better selection by the corporates.

On 20 and 21 January 2022, the department hosted its flagship event- the 'Industrial Colloquium'. It was a two-day event to bring out the Investor's Perspective for the participants. The event consisted of several rounds which helped the students to appreciate the various fundamentals of the stock markets and their functioning. Participants were also compelled to make decisions regarding the mergers and acquisitions of companies. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from more than 70 participants. This event tested the participants for their decision-making capabilities, team work, time-management and negotiation skills. The event was judged by CA Mudit Mutreja, Senior Finance Manager at IDP India.

On 18 February 2022, the department held a meet and greet for all the students after the reopening of the college. This meet not only helped the students to get familiar with their fellow batch mates but it also encouraged them to follow the footsteps of the seniors and the prestigious faculty members who always encouraged the students to push their limits and challenge themselves every day. The first offline event after the reopening of MAC saw the participation of over 40+ enthusiastic students filled with eagerness.

Entreuzest, the Annual flagship festival of the Business Economics Department, was organized on 21

and 22 April 2022. The much-awaited event comprises of various management and economics related activities, seminars, managerial, marketing and entrepreneurial skills of student participants with an element of fun. Organized by the students of the department under the guidance of the faculty members, Entrezest encourages the participants to apply what they learn in classrooms in a controlled & simulated environment where they can explore and learn more about their areas of interests. This year the festival comprised of the following events:

1. **Vaarta:** The annual alumni panel discussion was the inaugural event of our two-day Entrezest festivities. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Department of Economics has always been actively involved in academic exercises. The teachers of the department have been participating and presenting papers in various conferences, seminars and webinars at the national and international levels. The faculty members of the department have published papers in refereed journals and chapters in edited books. Various online platforms like Google Classroom, Google Meet, Moodle, and Zoom have been used by the faculty members to enhance the teaching experience and actively continue the learning process for students in the tough times of Covid 19 pandemic situation. Offline sessions with students have been highly interactive and student friendly.

DEPARTMENT OF ELECTRONICS

The department conducted orientation program on 23 November 2021 for the students admitted to the course in the year 2021. The orientation program was organized to identify and analyze the gaps between the skill set of the students admitted and those required to attain the specific learning outcomes of B. Sc. (H) Electronics course. On the basis of this analysis, students were provided Zero Lab Sessions to overcome the gaps.

To enhance academic attainments of its students’, learning environment was built through academic clubs in the department. The student’s society “TechTitans” was formed through election held on 2 March 2022 for the year 2021-22.

Various student clubs and workgroups were subsequently formed.

The TechTitan Society, organized its freshers for the first and the second-year students on 9 April 2022 and its annual festival “ElectroZeal - A Culmination of Talents!” comprising of both academic and cultural events on 21 and 22 April 2022 in offline mode. The ElectroZeal – 2022, comprised of four events to bring to fore the various dormant potential of students under the supervision of Prof. Maneesha, Dr. Natasha, Dr. Vandana Kumari and Dr. Sachin Kumar. The event attracted more than 40 teams in various events of the festival to showcased an amazing array of talents.

TechTitan society organized its intradepartmental cricket tournament from 18 – 19 April 2021. The students also participated in sports event organized by the Sports Committee and won two prizes in the Interdepartmental Basketball and Interdepartmental Volley Ball during 19 -23 April 2022.

Department of Electronics in collaboration with IEEE Electron Device Society, Delhi Chapter, organized an online Lecture talk on ‘CMOS Scaling: Negative Capacitance and Challenges Ahead’ by Prof. Merlyne De Souza, University of Sheffield on 3 December 2021; ‘5G- Be Ready for the Future’ by Ms. Rekha Jain, Team Leader, Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT) on 4 December 2021. Department of Electronics in collaboration with Training & Placement Cell and IEEE Electron Device Society Delhi Chapter also organized an online Lecture talk on ‘Landscape of Synaptic Weight Memories’ by Prof.

Shimeng Yu, Associate Professor, Electrical and Computer Engineering, Georgia Institute of Technology, Atlanta, GA, USA on 2 February 2022 and ‘Development of Automated Characterization Systems for Electronic Devices’ by Prof. Chetan J. Panchal, Department of Applied Physics, M. S. University of Baroda, Vadodara, India on 23 February 2022. The lecture series was aimed to establish an effective platform for institutions and academics to share their ideas, real time experiences and to motivate the work of scientists, engineers and educators. The lecture was attended by around 90 participants from all parts of the country. The intent towards this lecture series was to provide an interactive online platform to students and researchers with the scientists working in the area of electron devices and 5G technology and its applications through interactive discussions.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The Department of English organized several events and programs in this academic session. The events are as follows:

Inter-faculty Lecture Series (IFLS)

Aimed at sharing faculty research with students on the units in syllabi, IFLS was initiated by Assoc. Prof. Vinod Verma and Prof. Sangeeta Mittal, Asst. Prof. Charu Arya and Asst. Prof. Shilpa Gupta gave presentations as resource persons.

Annual Lecture 2021-22

This year the annual lecture was delivered by Dr. Sanjukta Dasgupta, Professor, Department of English, University of Calcutta. The title of the lecture was ‘Breaking Free: Colonial and Post-Colonial Bengali Women’s Writing’. The lecture was attended by all faculty and 75 students of the department. Prof Dasgupta gave a gendered perspective of women writers in Bengal focusing on the impact of colonialism on their work. The lecture specially focused on the traditions, transitions, and transformations of the Bengali Women’s writing of the pre- and post-colonial India. The lecture was organized on 7 December 2021 in the online mode by Prof. Prem Kumari Srivastava and Prof. Gitanjali Chawla. The Principal, Prof. Sanjeev Tiwari chaired the session and English Department TIC & Assoc. Prof. Vinod Verma expressed the vote of thanks.

The Election and Formation of ACTIVE Society was convened by the TIC & Assoc. Prof. Vinod Verma on 11 March 22, and facilitated by Asst. Prof. Dr. Guntasha, Asst. Prof. Dr. Subodh, Asst. Prof. Shilpa Gupta, Asst. Prof. Dr. Debosmita, Asst. Prof. Indrani, Asst. Prof. Aditya, and Asst. Prof. Nabanita. On receiving students’ request for an outstation educational tour, the department nominated Prof. Sangeeta Mittal as the tour coordinator, who put her best efforts to organize it. Finally, required number of students as per college policy remained unfulfilled leading to its cancellation.

LITERATI 2021-22

The three days literature festival was organized by the Department of English from 21 April 2022 to 23 April 2022.

Day One: Performing Monologues: Monopedia

The event was formally inaugurated by the Principal, Prof Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari. In his address to English Department teachers and students, he mentioned that English department is actively contributing to the literary and performing arts, and culture of the college. The Teacher-in-Charge of English Department, Assoc. Prof. Vinod Verma elaborated the vision and significance of the application of textual knowledge to making audio-visual performances. The Literature festival Coordinator Asst. Prof. Dr. Charu Arya welcomed the gathering.

The three days long literature festival began with the event of **Monopedia** to perform monologues in two rounds of competition levels. The faculty coordinators of Monopedia were Asst. The students thoroughly enjoyed the subject and completed their allotted projects, which was mandatory for the completion of the workshop.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

Department of Physics, Maharaja Agrasen College, organized a lecture on the **topic "semiconductor devices: theory and applications"** via online mode on 20th November 2021, under the Internal Quality Assurance Cell lecture series. The lecture was delivered by **Dr. Servin Rathi**, a research fellow from **University College London, United Kingdom**. Dr. Servin Rathi has published research papers in top international high-impact peer-reviewed journals. **He has 27 conference presentations to his credit and has published 43 research papers.** More than 200 participants including students from different colleges and faculty joined in the zoom meeting to get the best of the knowledge about how the research field is contributing towards the semiconductor devices. Dr. Servin Rathi explained all the important aspects of the application and theory of semiconductor devices. Apart from this, he showed important and beautiful pictures of London's important semiconductor laboratories and University College London. The lucid presentation with myriad illustrations on a complex topic such as this satiated the curiosity of the imaginative minds of students. Dr Rathi explained the great need for semiconductor devices in India, especially in Industrial manufacturing areas and high voltage applications, and that there is a great scope of this area too. He motivated the upcoming youth to research in this area so to benefit the nation. Students were very enthusiastic to know the research areas that this discussion generated, and which could be extremely beneficial for their future career in research in physics. The lecture was followed by question-and-answer sessions which were marked by a plethora of interesting questions by ever enthusiastic students and faculty. The session was well attended by around **200 participants**. Students also requested for more such lectures to be held in the future. The lecture ended with a vote of thanks by Dr. Asha Gupta, the teacher in-charge.

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

The Department of Political Science, Student Society, Chanakya, celebrated Kargil Diwas on 26 July 2021. Under the event various events were held like Extempore on 'Oratory with Bravery'; Slam Poetry on the theme 'Remember, Rejoice, Kargil Diwas', Quiz on 'Victory Quizerables' and Poster Making on 'Salute to the Indian Army'.

On 5-6 August 2021, the Department of Political Science held a National Conference on 'Perspective on Indian Democracy: One Nation, One Election' sponsored by ICSSR. The two-day National Conference

included a total of nine sessions. The Conference was held online and there was a total of 150 participants who attended the webinar. The Inaugural Address was given by Prof. Ujjwal Kumar Singh, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi. The Technical Sessions were on Elections and Constitutional Provisions, Changing Paradigm of Indian Democracy, Simultaneous Elections: Conceptual Analysis, Simultaneous Elections: Feasibility and its Consequences, Simultaneous Elections and its Impact on Indian Federal Structure. It was highlighted by the speakers that ‘Simultaneous elections’ will inculcate feeling of nationalism among the people. As the simultaneous election will see the country as a single unit and therefore generate the feeling of oneness and togetherness. The entire nation will debate and discuss the national issues and the local issues together. Therefore, there will be unity of issues in the country. Some speakers also said that the national and the local issues will get same kind of preference. Simultaneous election will also have positive impact on the culture and tradition of the country. It will culturally unify the nation and will generate unified tradition. In this way, it will play a great role in making a unified and strong nation. Some of the scholars during the conference further argued that simultaneous elections for parliament and state assemblies was not good for democracy on one hand and federal structure on the other. Some presentations provided examples of successful democracies of the world who had been following the process of simultaneous elections; like, South Africa, Sweden, Italy, etc. Many other factors such as role of governing political party or alliance, policy adopted, oppositional parties, state and regional parties, opinion polls, local bodies election, etc. were discussed during the conference in detail. The Valedictory Address was given by Prof. Nirmal Jindal, Principal, Satyawati College, University of Delhi.

On 25 September 2021, Department of Political Science held a lecture by Prof. Sri Prakash Singh, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi on ‘Ekaatam Maanav Darshan and Antodaya Sankalpana’. He highlighted the importance of Ekaatam Maanav Darshan and Antodaya Sankalpana philosophy of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay and related it with today’s time. On 28 September, 2021, the Department organized a lecture by Dr. Anshu Srivastava, Associate Professor, Political Science, IP College for Women, University of Delhi on ‘Liberalised India, Politicised Middle Class and Software Professionals’. During the lecture she introduced her book on liberalised India and also talked in detail about the middle class in India especially the software professionals. Her talk was based completely on the primary data that she had collected from her research. It was highly enriching and enlightening for the students as well as faculty members.

On 2 October 2021, the Student Society of the Department of Political Science, Chanakya Celebrated Gandhi Jayanti, Various competitions like Debate, Slam Poetry, Poster Making, Extempore were organized during this one-day event on the themes of Mahatma Gandhi’s philosophy. The guest speaker for the event was Ms. Mohini Mehta.

The Department of Political Science also held Department Orientation on 23 November 2021 for first year students to welcome them to the department through online mode. They were made aware of their papers for the semester and the syllabus. They were also given information about various activities of the department and the past events organised by the department.

The department also organized Constitution Day lecture on 30 November 2021 by Prof, Khagesh Gautam, Associate Professor of Law and Assistant Director, Centre for Public Law & Jurisprudence, Jindal Global Law School and Prof. M. P. Singh, former Professor of Political Science, University of Delhi, National Fellow of Indian Institute of Advanced Studies (IIAS), Shimla was the Discussant. This event was conducted in a blended mode and attracted large number of participants. Prof. Khagesh Gautam spoke on

“A Re-Examination of the Role of the President under our Indian Constitution”.

Chanakya, the Student Society of the Department of Political Science held an event from 24-26 January 2022 on the occasion of Republic Day where events like Debating on New Education Policy and Quiz on Indian History, economy, polity were held. The events saw active participation from the students of the department and other colleges of the University as well.

The Chanakya Annual Fest of the Department was held on 21-22 April 2022. The Inaugural Session was held on 21 April in the presence of the faculty and students of the department. There were various events organised during the fest like Quiz, Mock Elections, Be the Minister, Poster Making and Essay Writing. All the students of the department participated in the events as well organised the complete fest. The event was successfully concluded on the second day of the fest.

The department students also organized a Farewell for the passing out batch of 2022 on 26 April 2022. All the teachers and students participated in the event and bid farewell to the outgoing batch wishing them all the success in their future endeavours.

DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Department of Physical Education has conducted online classes followed by offline classes after the reopening of college in generic elective subject of physical education for semester 2 and 4. The department has a plan to make outdoor visit to the different fitness centre and stadiums of Delhi. The International Day of Yoga was organized in collaboration with sports committee, IQAC and NCC by the department in the hybrid mode where more than 200 students and teaching staff were present. The department also organized the Inter Department tournaments and Intra college events in active collaboration with sports committee. COMMITTEE REPORTS

ANNUAL ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

The Annual Activities Committee (MAC-AAC) under the guidance of the Convenor, Prof. Deepa Sharma and her team of faculty members – Ms. Indrani Das Gupta, Mr. Amit Kumar, Mr. Ankush Jindal, Ms Barkha Sain, and Mr. Ashutosh Kumar – successfully organized several events in the academic session of 2021-2022.

The first event under the aegis of AAC was the **Annual Day** conducted on 10 September 2021 for the batch of 2019 & 2020. Due to the persistent disruptions occasioned by the pandemic, the Annual Day program of 2019 & 2020 could not be held. So, in the current academic session, AAC ensured that our meritorious students were duly felicitated. In addition, this Annual Day event marked the inauguration of five Smart Classrooms in our College premises. These venues were the Conference Room, Committee Room, Auditorium, Room no. 237, and the ICT labs. If the Annual Day program marks the occasion when we appreciate and acknowledge the academic achievements of our students, their consistent hard work, these newly built Smart Classrooms paved the way for a more holistic and globally attuned pedagogical environment to flourish. This event highlighted a special chapter in the history of MAC where academic and curricular achievements' celebration was under-girded by our college's vision to promote a transformative global pedagogical environment. The Smart classrooms announced our futuristic visions on the educational map, where our students and faculty staff could effectively build upon the infrastructural facilities to pursue excellence in all the fields of pedagogical curriculum. These classrooms were inaugurated and the students were felicitated by the Chief Guest, Former Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi, Prof. PC Joshi, and the Guest of Honour, Dean of Colleges, Prof. Balram Pani, along with other esteemed dignitaries who had logged in online via Zoom. Also, our Principal, Dr. Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari tabled the Annual Reports of 2019 and 2020 in which he highlighted the major academic and co-curricular achievements of the college of the past two years. This event spawned the first hybrid, interactive exercise to take place and which has now become a standard practice in every other event conducted by our college.

The next event, the **8th Sardar Patel Memorial Lecture** was hosted by AAC on 31 October 2021 to celebrate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel, which is celebrated every year in the country as *Rashtriya Ekta Diwas* ("National Unity Day"). Alongside the 'Run for Unity' organized by the Sports Committee of the college, a short documentary film detailing the life and achievements of Sardar Patel was showcased for our hybrid audiences from the Smart Conference room. The Chief Guest for this occasion, Prof. Avinash Chandra Pandey, Director, Inter-University Accelerator Centre, Delhi & Former Director, Institute of Interdisciplinary Studies, University of Allahabad provided several anecdotes to highlight the greatness of this mass nationalist leader. Despite being a Sunday, large number of faculty and students participated in the event.

The third event organized under the aegis of AAC was the **College and Department Orientation Programme**. Conducted over a period of two days from 22 November 2021- 23 November 2021, the Orientation Programme underscored the occasion when the First years were for the first time initiated into their college life. To ease the students' journey of becoming a part of MAC family and to grapple with the

challenges that College life would offer, this day sought to provide the students with the basic information and knowledge related to all spheres of our college – from administration to sports to extracurricular and to academic courses. The first day enabled the students to grasp the various activities, units and practices conducted under the various sectors of administration, hostel, library, sports and other committees. The second day registered the orientation of different courses in the morning session, while the afternoon session observed the orientation of curricular committees like ECA, NCC, NSS and others. To commemorate the **Constitution Day**, the Annual Activity Committee in collaboration with the Department of Political Science organized a special lecture on “*A Re-Examination of the Role of the President under the Indian Constitution*” on 30 November 2021. The Constitution of India is more than a foundational document of the world’s largest democracy and this celebratory day registered the rights of each and every citizen of India while also elucidating the duties and responsibilities of every citizen. This year the celebration of our founding document of our democracy encapsulated the need to delve into the finer nuances of what frames the roles and responsibilities of the President of India. And to elaborate on this crucial facet of our democracy, the Guest Speaker who joined online for the occasion, Prof Khagesh Gautam, Associate Professor of Law and Assistant Director at Centre for Public Law & Jurisprudence at Jindal Global Law School illustrated how the President of India was more than simply a figurehead. To provide a more nuanced understanding of the constitutional role of the President of India, the discussant for the day, Prof. MP Singh, former Prof. of the Department of Political Science, University of Delhi and National Fellow of IAS, Shimla from our Smart Conference room - facilitated for the students and teachers alike on the significance of this founding document in our everyday, experiential lives. From listing on the values of governance, federalism, evolving constitutionalism, the two speakers ensured that we are reminded of our Constitution when it comes to justice, ethical actions, and grappling with the socio-political realities of India.

Next event organized by the Annual Activities Committee was the **8th Vivekananda Memorial Lecture** conducted in the online mode on **12 January 2022**. This year noted social luminary and cultural ideologue Prof. Girishwar Mishra, Former Vice-Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi Antarashtriya Hindi Vishwavidyalaya, Wardha was the keynote speaker. Prof. Mishra spoke on the significance of Swami Vivekananda’s thoughts and ideas for the current times. He said that Swamiji’s teachings presented us with not only a cohesive and empowering political vision and nation building, but also for self-awareness and actualization at the individual level, which must be the basis of positive social evolution. He emphasized not only the academic acumen and brilliance of Swami Vivekananda, but also his disciplined commitment to his goals, a feature that deserved to be emulated by the young generation.

Through these various programs, the Annual Activities Committee sought to engender amongst the students the need to be self-aware and self-consciously work towards building a new vision of their future and to participate in nation-building.

B. A. PROGRAMME COMMITTEE

B.A. Programme is a flexible, inter-disciplinary and choice-based programme that suits the needs and interest of the academicians. It is unique in the sense that it is diverse yet unified. The events were organized under the experienced guidance of the Committee members and Convener, Dr. Saumya Shukla who motivated students to take initiative and enhance their skills as organizers of different events and also as participants in not only the festival of BA Programme course but also in festivals organized by other departments of the college.

Students of BA Programme showed exceptional performance in sports, winning team game trophies for inter department Kabaddi matches for both men and women, inter department basketball matches for both men and women, as well as the interdepartmental trophy for football. Our students did us proud by winning many first positions and second positions in individual track and field events also.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

- Ashish Rajput (B. A. Programme, Third Year) won the Gold Medal in Senior Level Delhi State Archery Championships (March 2022)
- Ashish Rajput (B. A. Programme, Third Year) won the Silver Medal in Khelo India Archery Tournament

One of the major events started by the Sports Committee was the organization of the Maharaja Cup 2022, a five-days Inter College/University Sports Tournament. This event marked not only a new intensity of teammanship and exhibition of talent on the playing field but also after a gap of two years disrupted due to the ongoing pandemic, spread good cheer all round. The tournament saw three competitive sports being played: Football (Men & Women), Basketball (Men), Chess for Visually Disabled students. A total of 34 teams participated in the Men's Football Competition wherein Zakir Hussain College secured the first position, Dyal Singh College secured the second position, and Maharaja Agrasen College secured the third position. In the Men's Basketball Competition, 18 teams participated. Hansraj College won the winning title and Motilal Nehru College won the second position along with Ramjas College securing the third position. Women's Football listed saw Sri Ram College for Women as the first prize winner and Maharaja Agrasen College emerging as the second prize winner. The tournament also had a Chess Competition for Visually impaired participants and a participatory amount of 1000 rupees was allotted for each participant. Bharat from Shri Venkateshwar College won the first prize and Dinesh Chand from Hansraj College won the second prize.

The tournament began with the opening ceremony on 9 April 2022. The Guest of Honour, Shri Kuldeep Kumar, MLA from Kondli Constituency, East Delhi, highlighted the initiative taken by central and state governments to promote sports which included the opening of the Delhi Sports University. In the closing ceremony of this gala spectacle, the Chief Guest, Shri Surender Jaglan, the Chairman, Governing Body, Indira Gandhi Institute of Physical Education and Sports Sciences, University of Delhi discussed the importance of sports in nourishing and rejuvenating a society. He outlined how sports facilitates in pushing the boundaries of one's physical strength to use our skills and abilities and to never give up. The Guest of Honour, Shri Shaji Prabhakaran, the former FIFA South Central Asia Development Officer and currently the President of the Delhi Football Association observed how sports harmonized disparate elements in different communities and enabled us to break down walls.

The subsequent week, 19-23 April 2022 marked the Intra-College Sports tournament. This tournament with its competitive games sought to give a platform to both students and faculty to showcase their sporting talents. The events played were as follows: Cricket, Football, Basketball (M&W), Volleyball, Kabaddi (M &W), Carom, Badminton, 100 M Race, Relay race, Javelin, Shotput, and Long Jump. Each department of the College had to send an entry for respective sporting events. On 23 April 2022, the College celebrated its Sports day. This day outlined a special bonhomie between students and even the faculty staff despite the intense heat enjoyed the competitive pressure that any sporting activity entails.

STUDENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Student Advisory Committee organized a two-day National Student Academic Congress on 3-4 February 2022 on the theme of “Power of Education.” Following the earlier chapters of the Congress, this present chapter discussed the various dimensions of education within the Indian context. Enumerating on how

knowledge functions as power within our quotidian existence, the Congress conducted over two days and spread over six sessions discussed and deliberated on the history, policies, identity politics, and pedagogical shifts in teaching, learning, and syllabus formation as underscored in the National Education Policy 2022 and through past practices.

The Keynote speaker at this Congress, Padma Shri J.S. Rajput sought to align our educational needs and goals to the building of our nation's well-being. Shri Rajput offered a fascinating study of how education is part and parcel of our human consciousness. The Valedictory speaker, Prof. Sunil Sondhi provided a new meaning and impetus to our ancient knowledge systems. Whether it was in terms of grappling with newer modes of technologies and refashioning our interface with textual pedagogies or in remembering the modes of educational systems of ancient times, this present chapter of the National Student Academic Congress was a timely intervention as it sought to give voice to the many changes that had occurred in the field of education over the past two years because of the pandemic.

The Congress forced us to introspect on the significance of education, pedagogy, knowledge, and digital interfaces. Students from the undergraduate, postgraduate, and research scholars from across the country participated in this Congress and shared their views on education so as to prise open the locked doors of our socio-political, cultural, and historical imaginaries.

The end of this academic session (2021-22) saw another spectacle unfold under the aegis of the Student Advisory Committee. As per the Government of India's initiative, Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav was organized to celebrate the pluralistic and diverse colours of freedom of our proud nation. Through the organization of four competitions – Book Cover Design, Poster making, Rangoli Making and Face Painting, students sought to manifest the spirit of freedom in their everyday consciousness. This event allowed us to acknowledge our nationalist ethos while also adding new flavours to the idea of freedom.

MAC INITIATIVES/CENTRES/CLUBS/PROJECTS

AGRASEN BAROJI HAPPINESS INITIATIVE (ABHI)

The National Service Scheme of Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi, organized a three-day camp under the initiative Agrasen Baroji Happiness Initiative (ABHI). The camp was held in the village Baroji in Nuh district of Haryana.

It was headed under the guidance of the Principal, Prof. Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari and teacher coordinators- Mr. Amit Kumar, Dr. Sachin Kumar, Dr. Abha Sharma, Dr. Kingaule Newme, and Dr. Aditya Premjeet, Dr. Dilip Kumar, Dr. Vickey Mehriya, Dr. Chhavi Bhatnagar. The trip started when all the 39 students along with teacher coordinators reached the Baroji village around noon on 20 March 2022. The first task given to the students was to set up the camp at the Temple Mansa Devi.

Day One on 20 March 2022 - After cleaning the area, the Principal guided the students by giving important instructions. Subsequently, Mr. Amit Kumar recounted all the rules and responsibility for every student present there. Different teams were set up with tasks to smoothen the three days' activities: food distribution, drinking water management, sleeping, first aid, and creating a documentary.

Lunch prepared by the hired local caterer was distributed. After lunch, students were allotted a time of 2 hours (from 3:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.) for the preparation of the workshops that were to be conducted the very next day. Around 5:00 p.m. a tree plantation drive was carried out which was headed by the Principal and the teachers.

On the evening of 20 March 2022, activities like yoga, folk singing, and dancing sessions were conducted and which was participated by all the students with enthusiasm. The day's activities ended with dinner served at 8:30 p.m.

Day 2 started at 7:00 a.m. with a morning yoga session and the distribution of fruits among the faculty and students. After the refreshing yoga session, all the students were instructed to start preparing for 'Swachhta Abhiyaan' to be carried out in the Baroji village.

Swachhta Abhiyaan

The objective was to clean the village and give out the message of keeping the surroundings clean. The event started at 9:00 a.m. with all the students and teacher coordinators heading towards the village with brooms, dustpans, posters in their hands and zeal in their eyes.

While carrying out the 'Abhiyaan', the students and teachers during the interaction with the natives, teachers, and students got to know about the challenges related to fresh water and electricity faced by them.

Under the 'Abhi' initiative, a total of five workshops were conducted. These were based on the following:

- Women empowerment
- Personal hygiene
- Sports workshop

- Online learning
- Organic farming

Women Empowerment

To empower the women of the village, this workshop was organized. There were around 25 women who attended in the workshop. Through the workshop, women were introduced to benefit and importance of self-help groups (SHGs) and how surfing the internet to get registered easily to some economic groups by filling in some relevant information was conveyed. Social evils that are still prevalent like child marriage and the dowry system were also invigoratingly talked about. Women opened up and told that child marriage is still in practice in the village. Upon hearing this shocking truth, the team explained the penalty imposed by the government.

The first half of the workshop focused on the SHGs (Self Help Groups) and governmental schemes (e.g. Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojna, Samridh Scheme, etc) for women entrepreneurs so that they can grow and become financially independent while the second half of this workshop aimed at importance of education for girl child and some more schemes of state and national government promoting education and birth of a girl child (eg. Sukanya Samridhhi Yojna, Haryana Aapki Beti Humari Beti Yojna, etc) as well as the need for social equality amongst gender in our society and end social evils like child marriage and dowry.

At last, women were convinced and understood that they should carry out new ventures in all professions and how the education of girls is important.

Personal Hygiene

To prevent the spread of diseases and infections, personal hygiene is very important. So, to provide the knowledge in this context, a workshop on personal hygiene was organized.

There were around 50 people in the workshop amongst which 30 were children and approximately 20 were ladies. Children were taught to brush their teeth twice a day, trim their nails properly, cover the mouth with a handkerchief on sneezing, and many more such points. The children got to know how to keep the environment around them hygienic in school by cleaning their school bags and dresses, changing socks, and wearing a clean mask on a daily basis.

Information on the menstrual cycle was shared with ladies and girls. At the end of the workshop, sanitary pads were also distributed. Some ladies were trying to hide the pads inside the book or inside their sarees showing the embarrassment they felt carrying a sanitary pad in their hands. But it was explained to them that they need not feel awkward and embarrassed. The team was successful in emphasizing the importance of personal hygiene.

Sports Workshop

The workshop started on an interactive note by questioning the children about games they usually play in the village. Children shared that they played games like ice & water, hide n seek, cricket, ludo, snake & ladder, and many more.

The children were very curious about outdoor games like cricket, hockey, football and the advantages attached with these games. Children were explained about the qualities they get from playing games like leadership skills, discipline, punctuality etc. Children were told about the **Khelo India Programme** and how it works.

At last, all the children performed some basic exercises. The cheerful smile and excitement during the workshop served as a successful ending.

Online Class Workshop

In the workshop, the team had explained the meaning of online teaching and the various advantages associated with it. Children already were familiar with online class platforms like Zoom and Google Meet as they used them during Covid lockdown. It came to light that only the boys were actively taking online classes during the lockdown whereas girls were not allowed to take online classes as they were bound to do household work. The main aim to organize this workshop was to inform them regarding online classes which would be conducted in near future by ‘Akshar’ volunteers of the college under NSS, 2-3 days a week.

Organic Farming Workshop

In present times, chemical-laden food is harming both our health and the environment. Simultaneously, there has been an inclination from people for having organic food in their diet. Upon evaluating the current times’ rising demand and the need of the hour, a workshop was organized on organic farming to spread awareness amongst farmers of the village Baroji, Nuh.

The presentation addressed the followings:

- What is organic farming?
- The techniques used
- The advantages of organic farming,
- Challenges associated
- The cost & profit analysis
- The government training institutes & policies.

For the workshop, the District Horticulture Officer of Mewat (Nuh) Mr. Deen Mohammed was also invited to share his opinions. Although the farmers were a bit hesitant in the beginning, later they showed active interest and even participated during the presentation. After the engaging presentation, the guest shared his personal experiences and insightful trivia to encourage the farmers to start organic farming and made them aware of the government’s schemes to support the farmers.

Finally, it was all concluded with a patriotic poem sung by one of the team members.

To make these workshops more interesting for children, members of NATARAJ and SEPTUNE, the dance and music society of Maharaja Agrasen College entertained kids with their performances. After the workshops, a drawing competition was also conducted by the student volunteers.

DAY 3

The third day was for trekking on the Aravalli hills and visiting Indore Fort situated on top of the hill. For guidance, former Principal, Dr. Sunil Sondhi, of Maharaja Agrasen College was invited, who accompanied the students. Doing this for more than 50 years now, a veteran in trekking- he instructed about the safety protocols and told how mental toughness plays a huge role in successfully completing any trek. The trekking started around 7:00 am with all the students, teachers, and the guests being a part of it. Many hurdles were faced by the first-time trekkers, like heavy breathing, dehydration, and balancing oneself during the tough terrain etc. The hills were full of thorn plants and steep climbs. After about 2 hours, everyone reached the top of the hill and in the break time pictures were clicked. Subsequently, a lake was seen filled with algae, surrounded by historic red sandstone. Moving forward, a tombstone and a fort was also seen. The marbles used in making them had almost turned black due to oxidation. It was also a common hanging spot for the residents of Baroji. From there, everyone retraced back the path taken to climb the hills. After reaching the ground, the local people took everyone to their homes for water. Afterwards, everyone reached the temple, took some rest, and had lunch. And finally, after the amazing three days in Baroji, we came back home.

This initiative taught many different things: how the native people were leading their lives, the challenges faced by them, and the students learnt how to live with minimal resources, teamwork, and how to persist in unfavorable conditions.

After the visit, the NSS motto has attained its principle of **‘NOT ME, BUT YOU’**.

COLLABORATION WITH BAROJI VILLAGE

The village of Baroji is located in Mewat (Nuh) District, Haryana. The village lies in the foothills of Aravalli hill. It constitutes 150-200 families. The village has a rich heritage and culture. The village has two temples, one of Lord Shiva and another of Mansa Devi which is right outside the village (800 years old and is operated by the 28th generation of the same family). It also has two mosques and a ‘gaushala’.

The stay was in the premises of the Mansa Devi Temple. The climate was moderately warm with cool winds gusting throughout the day. The district shares its boundaries with Gurugram in the north and Faridabad and Palwal in the East. The dialect commonly used is Haryanvi.

Out of the Hindus, the majority of the population belongs to the ‘Saini’ community. We also met Mr. Susharma Saini, the Sarpanch of the village. The major occupation of the villagers is agriculture followed by animal husbandry and cattle breeding. Earlier the farmers were involved in horticulture but due to high efforts to grow fruits & veggies, and the convenience of MSP, they shifted to growing wheat and mustard instead. The sandy nature of the soil, scarce water levels (below 100ft deep), its salty nature and poor electricity supply make agriculture hard for the farmers. To solve the problem of water, canal water distribution work is in progress.

People also work on a contract basis with government colleges and some even migrate to different cities especially Delhi NCR for labor works. The market opportunities are abundantly present due to its geographical location. Mostly all women in the village are housewives while some are involved in

farming and construction activities. The village also has Self Help Groups running for them where they do activities such as sewing and knitting.

Parda System for women is still very much prevalent in the village. They collect wood, make Cow Dung cakes, and use them as fuel. An average family at Baroji consists of three children. The village has a Hindi medium government secondary school, after which the children commute to Nuh city for their higher studies. Covid times have brought online education in the village. However, the online method only helped boys, girls in the village were bound to do the household chores. Girls get married as soon as they complete their schooling. They have stereotypical norms for marriages such as marrying their girl to boys hailing from Sohna as they are businessmen and are wealthy whereas bringing daughters in law from Alwar as according to them the Girls from there are 'Well-Mannered'.

There was state-funded ITI Colleges nearby. On interacting with children, it was found that the ITI is Hindi-Medium just like the middle school of the village, hence going to the ITI is the standard career option for the children. Opting for any other courses/ institutes comes up with a language barrier. But a boy named Amir Khan is pursuing B.VOC (in English) in Agriculture from Vishwakarma University, Gurugram and he further wishes to pursue a master's in the same subject. There are Polytechnic Colleges in Sohna, Government Medical College close to Baroji and JBT also was established 2-3 years ago. Due to the regressive nature of their society, girls are not given enough opportunities but the team was delighted to come across a girl named Jaya, a 9th class student who aspires to join the Army after her studies but will she be able to break the shackles?

CENTRE FOR PERFORMING ARTS AND CULTURAL STUDIES (CPACS)

Centre for Performing Arts and Cultural Studies (CPACS), Department of English, MAC DU has been promoting performing arts and cultural studies through its focus on live demonstration of theatre based multi-media and cinematic arts since its inception in 2014. The year 2021-22 as has been half online mode and half offline mode, CPACS was actively involved in both the modes to reach MAC students and teachers for bringing connect of performing arts to life situations. During the period of pandemic, CPACS was engaged with bringing news of online availability of performing arts events, workshops and training links to develop engagement with performing arts for stories of resilience, health and care including mit-press-journal TDR. The Drama Review Students' Essay contest info and guidance. As CPACS had conducted theatre making workshop LETTERS in collaboration with Arvind Gaur's Asmita Theatre Group, continuing its networking with resource persons and practitioners of theatrical arts CPACS shared the info of online live performances of Asmita regularly with students and staff members through social media groups. The link of live performance by Asmita 'Godse @ Gandhi.Com', a fiction fantasy play by Ashgar Vajahat, was shared on 30th January 2022 to promote online play watching. The play is a fictional-fantasy dialogue between the two historical figures. Another significant online event attended and shared by CPACS was the official launch of the Pandit Jasraj Cultural Foundation with an address by the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India and Video messages from distinguished Musicians viz. Pt. Shivkumar Sharma, Padma Vibhushan; Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia, Padma Vibhushan; Ustad Amjad Ali Khan, Padma Vibhushan; Dr. L Subramaniam, Padma Bhushan; Dr. N Rajam, Padma Bhushan.

After DU's return from online to campus mode of teaching, CPACS has been imparting skills and customized workshops on basics of music, theatre, photography and cinematography to interested students whether as individuals or groups. During MAC visit to Sikkim Univ. for educational and cultural exchange, CPACS Coordinator and Activity Director Vinod Verma conducted a three-day workshop 'Kangchenjunga' on photography and cinematography for a group of students who were documenting the tour through camera.

To promote theatrical activities, CPACS shared info of majestic musical play Babasaheb: The Grand Musical presented by the Government of Delhi from 25 February 2022 to 12 March 2022. CPACS disseminated the info on the play and musical theatre with students and staff members of MAC, arranged tickets for the show and some teachers and students of MAC watched the Musical 4 pm show on 10 March 2022.

EK BHARAT SHRESHTHA BHARAT CLUB

EBSB-Yuvutsav 2022 - Annual Cultural Competition

The Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB) Club, of Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi, one of the government's key flagship programmes, successfully organized its event Yuvutsav' 22 on 1 April 2022. The event was held in the college auditorium and was witnessed by more than 200 people.

The club celebrated the spirit of dance and the diversity of culture in India by organizing a Cultural Dance Competition. In the event, seven shortlisted teams from various colleges participated wherein they represented the culture of different states such as Rajasthan, Punjab, Delhi, etc. in their performances.

EBSB-Tour to Partnering State-Sikkim

In trying to aim for the cultural unification of India as part of the "New India by 2022" goal, Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat (EBSB), Club of Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi coordinated an educational tour to Sikkim. The purpose of the trip being the expansion of students' knowledge and a broader acquaintance with Sikkim culture, history, and traditions in a comprehensive manner so as to inculcate a better insight of this North-East state of India. The seven-days journey from 5- 12 April 2022 was comprised of 19 students and 4 professors.

Gangtok, the capital of Sikkim, the first stopover in the journey welcomed the team with its scenic beauty and cool weather. The students had the privilege of meeting the Hon'ble Governor of Sikkim, Shri Ganga Prasad. The Governor highlighted the importance of time and stated that a person who didn't procrastinate and was capable of managing time could triumph over all odds.

The team visited Enchey Monastery which was built in the year 1908 by the 10th King of Sikkim- Sikyong Tulku. The Monastery, the oldest in Gangtok, is around 200 years old and is home to approximately 90 monks. The three most prominent deities worshiped in the monastery are Buddha, Loketeswara, and Guru Padmasambhava. This ancient place provided a historical knowledge ranging from the stone-paved roads to its entire architecture.

The next visit place on the bucket list was the Pakyong Village. Here, the students gained experience about the village customs of a Sikkimese rural culture. The team halted in the oldest house of the village

which was 248 years old and had an interaction with one of the oldest couples of the village where our students learnt about their lifestyle, food habits, organic culture etc. and also had an organic Sikkimese lunch prepared in the homes of these villagers. After lunch, the student group visited the National Research Center for Orchids (ICAR). The place, like the rest of Sikkim, was full of mesmerizing flora and fauna. The Director of the Centre expounded to everyone, the numerous facts about Orchid plants.

On the third day, the students were taken for sightseeing to Ganeshtok, Plant Conservatory, Tashi View Point, Gonjang Monastery, Bakthang Waterfall and then to Sikkim University where they organized a special function for our students. The people were very hospitable and cordial. First and foremost, they offered an Angavastram to each instructor and student as a token of reverence. The event commenced with a brief introduction followed by a speech from the EBSB Nodal Officer of the Sikkim University, Dr Sujata Upadhyay. They, as a representation of the Sikkim culture, performed a few Nepali songs prepared by the Department of Music and even recited a few native language poems by the History Department of the university.

On the final day of the visit to Sikkim, students were taken to South Sikkim and visited Char Dham, which is a replica of all the Char Dhams that are there in India i.e., Badrinath of Uttarakhand, Dwarka of Gujarat, Puri of Orissa, and Rameshwaram of Tamil Nadu. The next destination was Ravangla-a renowned tourist spot in Southern Sikkim. Buddha Park was one of the destinations with its extended stairs, fountains, trees, architecture, steep structure, and which made the place more enthralling. The place was heavenly and peaceful. The trip ended with a visit to the most popular tea estate of Sikkim, Timi Tea Garden.

On 11 April 2022, the team left the guest house for New Jalpaiguri Railway Station. On 12 April 2022, the team arrived at Anand Vihar Railway station before midnight and headed for their respective homes. The adventure came to an end, but memories remain forever. The trip was a great learning experience and a good adventure for the students with many learning intakes from Sikkim and its varied cultural traditions.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSE FOR PROFESSIONAL SUCCESS (LEVEL -3)

The third chapter of the English Language Course for Professional Success – Level-3 was initiated on an enthusiastic and a promising note on January 17, 2022. Conceptualised in a hybrid-mode, this course commenced under the aegis of Abdul Kalam Centre, Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi and supervision of its course-coordinator, Prof. Prem K. Srivastava and co-coordinators and resource-persons/session-instructors, Dr. Guntasha K. Tulsi and Ms. Indrani Dasgupta. In its well-planned objective of addressing comprehensive proficiency-based needs of the learners/participants, the course was designed for 30 hours with an integrated focus on various skills and sub-skills related to RWSL-GV (Reading/Writing/Speaking/Listening/Grammar & Vocabulary).

The exemplary success of the first two chapters of this course in the consecutive years of 2019 and 2020, and its ability of positioning language-based needs and related demands in the contemporary professional arena, led to a jubilant and heart-warming response in the latest ELCPS chapter. Receiving over 300+ registrations, the final registration for the course saw 60 students from various courses, semesters, and institutions. The course also witnessed the enrolment/participation of students from other institutions

within and outside University of Delhi. These include enrolment from Delhi University colleges such as Bhagini Nivedita College, Sri Aurobindo College and Zakir Hussain Delhi College, as well as external institutions such as Lakulish Yoga University (Ahmedabad), Jamia Millia Islamia (Delhi) and St. Paul's Cathedral Mission College (Kolkata).

Ranging above two hours, every session utilised a combination of creative learning and ELT (English Language Teaching) methodologies to open the learner's mind to the comprehensive skills which are integral to language learning and personality development. From role-plays to building word-charts; from poetry and story-telling sessions to the decoding of grammar through task-based learning, visual descriptions, translation activities, use of music and related props; from an analysis of writing strategies to guidance and tips provided on stress, accent, pronunciation, voice-modulation and voice-emphasis—these sessions have a targeted and an intensive approach towards ensuring that each learner participates, interacts, writes and performs in groups or pairs or individually. Additionally, at the end of every session, learners are provided with handouts, reading materials and follow-up tasks, which become the basis of intervention and discussion for the subsequent sessions.

Currently ongoing through the virtual tele-conferencing platforms (Google Meet and Zoom), these sessions have been customised as per the norms of eventual conduct in the ICT-enabled smart classrooms, where through the use of smart-screens, online-broadcast, speaker-enabled environment, maximum benefit was availed via the online-offline/hybrid format. The course eventually concluded with sessions on formative and summative assessment, and which enabled the instructors to prepare an individual response sheet for each learner. Thus, response sheet was a meaningful roadmap for the students' future involvement with English language learning.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi organized a national workshop on 'Digital Accessibility as a Right' on 8 March 2022. The workshop was also arrayed nationwide via the medium of online meeting platform, Zoom. In today's world, digital accessibility is the new normal. Since the world fell into the clutches of the global pandemic COVID-19, digital accessibility is no longer an aspect of a personal choice but has turned into an indispensable need. However, the question worth looking at, is whether everyone has an equal access to all the digital platforms catering to the various walks of life or not?

The event was inaugurated by our Patron, Professor Sanjeev Kumar Tiwari, Principal of Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi. Prof. Tiwari emphasized not only on the significance of digital accessibility 'for all' in the current times, but also underlined the need for creating an awareness among all that digital accessibility is everyone's right.

Three resource persons, namely, Mr. Rahul Bajaj, Senior Resident fellow, Vidhi Centre for Legal Policy; Mr. Amir Jain, Legal Counsel, Accenture, and Mr. Turab Chimthanawala, Lawyer and Company Secretary, deliberated on the said theme and emphasized that 'digital accessibility' should be a right for all, irrespective of one's class, caste, gender or even disability. From online shopping of grocery items to daily

essentials, ordering for life saving medicines to booking an appointment with a doctor, ordering food to life style products/ gadgets, booking cabs, bus/ train/ air tickets and so on, digital accessibility is something that shapes and defines the aesthetics of our life experiences. Mr. Rahul Bajaj helped the students gain a conceptual understanding of ‘what is digital accessibility’ and ‘why does it matter?’ Mr. Amar Jain elaborated on the social and legal implications of facilitating web accessibility to persons with disabilities. Mr. Turab Chimthanawala highlighted how digital accessibility impacts and alters the aesthetics of life for the persons with disabilities. The workshop emphasized on the need for embracing ‘universal designing’ to make end products, whether, physical, multi-media or digital, accessible to persons with all kinds of disabilities. Talk back on mobile phones, speech synthesizing software’s on computers, voice over on Google Maps, audio description to the visual content on Netflix, adding subtitles to the visual content, easy to access web sites, disability specific software’s and applications, etc., are some of the measures that are already in place to ensure digital accessibility for persons with disabilities. However, these assistive technology solutions are very limited, expensive, and also not available across the board. The workshop emphasized on the need to making it available to persons with disabilities at an affordable price. The Equal Opportunity Cell in collaboration with the Extra-Curricular Activities Committee at Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi, organized a special performance by persons with disabilities during the inaugural session of the college’s annual cultural festival Yuvaan 2022 on 12 April 2022. Nine performers including three persons on wheel chairs and 6 persons with hearing impairment from the dance academy ‘We Are One’ rendered their mesmerizing performance in Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel auditorium of the college. We Are One, is a Charitable Trust. The group comprises of differently able artists on wheel chairs and hearing and speech impaired artists who believe that dance has no barriers. The founder of this dance academy, Mr. Husnain has been appreciated by the former President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee & Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam and the President of Singapore, Halima Yaqoob for his endeavours in promoting artists with disabilities. We Are One artists have performed in more than ten countries. First of their kind, these performances include rendition of Indian Classical dance forms, Martial Arts, Yoga and several other dance forms by persons with disabilities, whether on wheel chairs or with speech and hearing impairment. Performance by We Are One artists at MAC gave an entirely different spin on the view of the ‘disabled’ body and introduced the audience to not only a new alternative aesthetics of disability but also a counter-aesthetic of ability. All the dignitaries, faculty members and students were first spell bound by their amazing performance and then shocked to learn that six of the performers on stage performing Indian Classical dance were in fact speech and hearing impaired. The said performance offered a discourse on normalcy in opposition to disability. The objective of organizing such a performance was not mere entertainment, but to sensitise the college community about the issues pertaining to disability as well as to initiate transformation in the pre-conceived notions about disability. EOC at MAC believes that such performances are pioneering steps towards an innovative way of promoting disability cultural activism in India. The Equal Opportunity Cell in collaboration with the Sports Committee at Maharaja Agrasen College organized an ‘Inter-College Chess Competition’ on 12 April 2022 and 13 April 2022. The said competition was inclusive in nature as it invited participation from both able-bodied persons and persons with visual disabilities. Moreover, the players got an opportunity to compete with each other irrespective of the consideration of their ability/ disability. More than hundred students from the various colleges of University of Delhi registered for the competition through the Google form circulated through various channels. Ten

participants who attained the winning positions on the first day of the competition were invited on the second day of the competition to compete with the students with visual disabilities.

On 13 April 2022, nine able-bodied players competed with nine visually-disabled players in the game of chess. Tactile Chess Boards with Tactile Chessmen were facilitated to make the competition accessible for students with visual disabilities. After four rounds of intensive brain storming, Mr. Bharat (VH) from Venkateshwara College, D.U., Mr. Dinesh Chand (VH) from Hansraj College, D.U. and Mr. Vishesh (able-bodied) from Maharaja Agrasen College, D.U. won the first three positions respectively. Appreciation prizes to two students with visual disabilities, namely, Miss Sunita from MAC and Mr. Narender from Hansraj College were also awarded. The Equal Opportunity Cell in collaboration with the Training and Placement Cell at Maharaja Agrasen College, University of Delhi organized a workshop on 'CV making and How to appear in job interviews' for students with disabilities in Room no: 129 in the college premises on 25 April 2022. Thirteen students from PwD category registered for the said workshop and benefited from the same. Further, eight PwD students with four TPC student volunteers and TPC teacher coordinator Dr. Sachin Kumar went to participate in the Mega Job Fair (for students with disabilities) organized by School of Open Learning, University of Delhi at Gandhi Bhawan, North Campus, University of Delhi on 26 April 2022 from 9:00 AM onwards. This job fair gave an opportunity to the PwD students at MAC to interact with the employers and gain an understanding of the job skills they need to acquire to enter into the job market. Three MAC students, namely, Mr. Rahul Giri from B. A. (Political Science) Honours, Mr. Jatin from B. A. Program and Mr. Nimish Taneja from B. A. (Journalism) Honours, got job offers from Concentrix, My Moneymintra and IBM. With an aim to promote inclusion and accessibility for persons with disabilities in higher education, the Equal Opportunity Cell at Maharaja Agrasen College submitted its recommendations for the constitution of an Enabling Committee comprising of representatives from all important verticals of the college.

The Equal Opportunity Cell at Maharaja Agrasen College at MAC has also submitted its recommendations to the college to procure Tandem Bikes to make the college's cycling activities more inclusive. Tandem Bikes are special cycles designed for persons with disabilities. The procurement of such bike/s will facilitate the participation of persons with disabilities in cycling expeditions and competitions organized in the college.

GANDHI STUDY CIRCLE

Gandhi Study Circle together with Navchetna Parishad organised shikshak Vidyarthi samvad on 2nd October 2021 in which student competed for bhajan, documentary presentation, etc.

INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE (ICC)

Maharaja Agrasen College Internal Complaints Committee is constituted to comply with the norms specified in Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. The committee comprises of Ms. Puneeta Agarwal as Presiding Officer, Prof Gitanjali Chawla and Prof Tej Narayan Ojha from teaching faculty Ms. Heena Jain from administrative staff, two student representatives and Ms. Manisha Narayan as external member, Lawyer by profession. Maharaja Agrasen College has

always been following Zero tolerance policy against Sexual harassment and providing safe environment to its students, staff and employees.

Internal complaint committee organized a ten-days' online add on course on 'Legal Awareness' for all students of the college. This course was conducted by Delhi State Legal Authority in association with Maharaja Agrasen College, to spread awareness about the important laws and statutes enacted in India. Add on course was conducted from 27 October 2021 to 12 November 2021 covering various topics of importance such as Constitution of India, Fundamental rights and duties, Basic laws relating to filing of FIR, Zero FIR, Victim Compensation Scheme, Gender Justice Laws, Domestic Violence Act, Dowry Prohibition Act, Family Laws, Laws relating to children, Right to Information Act, Motor Vehicles Act, etc. More than 80 students completed the course. Inaugural session was addressed by Sh. Deepak Jagotra, Ld. Member Secretary, DSLSA(East).

An online session was organized on 8 September 2021 on the occasion of International Literacy Day addressed by Sh. Kamaljeet Arora, Ld. Member, Secretary, Delhi State Legal Services briefing on the Importance of legal literacy and services provided by DSLA to citizens of Delhi.

IGNOU

Ojha, along with his able team of Assistant Coordinators – Dr. Omkar Singh, Dr. Chhavi Bhatnagar, Mr. Amit Kumar, Dr. Jitendra Kumar Bhagat, Mr. Rajesh Pandey, Dr. Roushan Kumar (Program Facilitator) and the administrative staff comprising of Mrs. Nidhi Singh, Mr. Rajesh Kumar, Mr. Jaswant Singh, Mr. Naresh Kumar, Mr. Ashok Kumar, Mr. Ashok Atri, Mr. Pramod Kumar Singh, Mr. Harshvardhan, Mr. Kishan Kumar, Mr. Naveen Chandra Chamoli, Mr. Vinod Kumar Tiwari, Mr. Manoj Kumar, Mr. Anil Kumar, and Mr. Ajay Kumar, the IGNOU center continues to flourish. The center aspires to integrate the community by providing quality education to a larger section of deprived society. The Study Centre strives to provide best services to its students.

This year marked a number of achievements for IGNOU centre. These are as follows:

Achievements

IGNOU centre at Maharaja Agrasen College is the only centre in Delhi which provides counseling to MSCMACS students. Some of our students have joined prestigious services. Four of our management students have passed CA exam and few students have joined Delhi University as Assistant Professors and few students have joined the field of Banking and School Teaching.

Problems/Challenges

A lot of problems are there but we at MAC seek to solve the issues by following the protocols of democratic process.

Suggestions

We are very much satisfied with the kind of service provided by the Regional Centre and we are sure that we will continue to obtain the support of the Centre and secure other services in future as well.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Maharaja Agrasen College, has been continually working to develop a quality system to improve the academic and administrative performance of the College. The mandate of MAC- IQAC is to develop an all-inclusive quality culture in the college by channelling and synergizing the efforts of all constituent stake holders of the college, and work towards academic excellence and progress.

The MAC- IQAC comprising of the Principal as Chairperson and Prof. Maneesha as the Coordinator along with the teachers-in-charges of each department of the college and administrative officials work in tandem to prepare the academic calendar prior to the commencement of the session.

The issues arising due to lockdown necessitated by Covid-19 were discussed and following measures were undertaken at college level:

- The sudden outbreak of the Covid-19 pandemic led to a drastic shift in the teaching learning process from face-to-face interactive teaching to teaching only in the online mode. Two surveys were conducted to elicit the satisfaction levels of students with reference to these shifts in the academic year 2020-21. The responses were analyzed and appropriate actions were taken to augment the quality in teaching learning process in the college.
- The college purchased and provided 75 Laptops to faculty and administrative staff to facilitate smooth teaching learning and administrative operations in the online mode.
- Five Smart hybrid classrooms equipped with state-of-the-art multi-media teaching aids with 86 & 75-inch LCD screens, which are internet enabled with interactive panels and provide readers with embedded scanners, cameras and speakers were installed. These have been very useful in the conduct of webinars and special lectures in the hybrid mode during the pandemic.
- Fees problem resolution – Students facing financial hardships were given the options of paying fees in 2/3 equal instalments vide letter no. 3152 dated 22 October 2020 and financial help was offered to students who had lost a parent/parents vide letter no. 112 dated 9 June 2021.

Regular counselling and mentoring were provided by faculty to the students.

- An Interactive workshop on ‘Yoga for Holistic, Health, & Wellness’ was conducted online on 21 June 2021 for students, faculty and non- teaching staff for holistic wellness.
- Fit India run 2.0 was organized on 15 September 2021 to commemorate Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav in collaboration with Physical Education Department and NCC.
- A two-day hands-on workshop on Technology Assisted Learning through smart classrooms on 23-24 September 2021 was organized to enable faculty to use smart classrooms and its ICT enables technology for classes and webinars.
- An online awareness programme on the topic ‘Sexual Harassment at Workplace’ was organized on 10 February 2021. Ms Sonal Chauhan, Legal Aid Counsel, from East District Legal Services

Authority explained in detail about various laws pertaining to Sexual harassment at workplace to the audience which comprised of students, teaching faculty and non-teaching staff.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

National Cadet Corps is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi. NCC is Tri-Services Organization, comprising the Army, Navy and Air Wing, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens.

With its vision to empower volunteer youth to become potential leaders and responsible citizens of the country; it is open to school, college and university students all over India. Discipline and unity are the way of life and with this very motto our prestigious college has introduced NCC unit under 2 Delhi Girls Battalion for the very first time in this academic session 2020-21.

Even during the pandemic cadets did not stop their activities. With about 103 cadets at present our cadets have been practicing, attending camps, doing community service etc.

About 13 cadets have already attended Online EBSB Camp which aimed at making the cadets aware about the culture of different states. Cadets have been participating in different events such as Environment Day, Yoga Day, Tree Plantation drive, Cleanliness Drive, Social and Community Service such as Punnet Sagar Abhiyan, Pulse Polio Immunization etc.

During Common Annual Training camp our cadets give their best and participated in all the competition and won many individual prizes and the most significant of all these competitions was the Drill Competition where our college won the first prize eventually creating the history by being the first batch and winning the first prize. Though very new to NCC unlike other college with no senior to help and guide, our cadets got opportunity to be the part of All India Ajmer Trek and All India Darjeeling Trek. 6 of our cadets were also selected to be the part of Special National Integration Camp and participated in PM Rally. JUO Sonali Joshia got ADG Award for the same.

It has been a very fruitful journey so far with active, energetic, enthusiastic, cadets guided by Mugdha Khemka, an NCC 'C' Certificate holder from our college who have been with the cadets from the very beginning since the first enrolment and still helping and training the cadets till now.

NCWEB

Maharaja Agrasen College started the teaching center in June 2011 to strengthen the vision of NCWEB

for promoting college/higher education for girls with the flexibility of taking classes on non-working days.

The total enrolment at the NCWEB Maharaja Agrasen College Center for the session 2022-2023 is approximately 1297 which consist of 434 in B.Com. and 863 in B.A. (P) course with 140 new admissions in B.com and 270 new admissions in B.A. (P). The Centre has successfully completed the classes scheduled for the academic session 2021-22 with the strength of 40 teaching and a dozen of non-teaching staff. The 2021 result analysis for passout is as follows: B.A. (P) a total of 283 students appeared for the exams out of which 53 secured first division, 206 secured second division and 12 secured third division. In B. Com a total of 156 students appeared for the exams out of which 148 secured first division, 6 secured second division and 2 secured third division. The passing percentage for the session 2021-2022 in B. Com course is 100% and 95.7% in B.A (P) course.

Maharaja Agrasen College, NCWEB teaching center organized its annual prize distribution ceremony of the academic years 2019-20 and 2020-21 on 19 September 2021. Dr. Nisha Agrawal and Dr. Ritu Kohli presided over the function. Meritorious students of the academic sessions 2019-20 and 2020-21 as well as Spardha 2019-20 and E-Spardha 2020-21 winners were given prizes for establishing milestones in fields like cultural sports, co-curricular activities. Class Representatives (CR's) were also felicitated by the guests.

On 3 October 2021, "Vasundhara" nature club of our college organized a 'Nest Making Workshop' for the student members of the club to generate awareness amongst the students on the need for bird conservation. The guest of honor for the day was Mr. Rakesh Khatri, founder of Eco Roots Foundation and popularly known as the "Nest Man of India". He interacted with the students and enriched them with his experience in the field of bird conservation and encouraged students to contribute to bird conservation.

The Centre also organized its first offline cultural fest post COVID lockdown "Spardha 2022" on 13rd March 2022, Sunday in the college. We received a total of 342 student entries for participating in various events. Many events were organized for students enabling them to unleash their talent and we were glad to see such an active participation from the students. Events like Rangoli making, Mehendi, Poster making, Best out of Waste, Debate etc. were conducted. In the end we had an enthralling dance, singing & fashion show performance by students where they showcased dresses made of newspaper. Puneeta Mam (teacher in charge) encouraged students to discover their hidden talent and wished them for a bright future.

Our students also participated in various University level competitions and received awards adding to the glory of NCWEB MAC. In this context, Ms. Sejal Jain of our Centre won first prize in 'Best out of Plastic Waste' competition organized by NCWEB, University of Delhi on 27 August 2021 on the occasion of "Swatantrata Amrit Mahotsav: Ek Saptah Rashtra Ke Naam".

Ms. Vandana of our Centre won second prize in self composed Hindi poetry recitation organized by NCWEB, University of Delhi on the occasion of International Women's Day 2022 on 14 March 2022.
